1. BETTI, Adolfo. Signed. Photo. 1932.

The wonderful Italian violinist (1873-1950), was a student of Cesar Thomson. He was the first violinist of the Flonzaley Quartet from 1903 until it disbanded in 1929. He is shown in a 1/2 length portrait, seated, holding a book. Inscribed to J. C. Freeman and signed "Adolfo Betti" followed by the date. (10 x 8 inches, minor mounting traces on verso) A wonderful photo of this very important violinist. \$250.00

2. BETTI, Adolfo. Autograph Letter Signed.

The wonderful Italian violinist (1873-1950), was a student of Cesar Thomson. He was the first violinist of the Flonzaley Quartet from 1903 until it disbanded in 1929. He has written to Dr. Keffer a letter about an appointment and about sending a package, and signed "Adolfo Betti." (7 1/4 x 10 1/2 inches, folds) \$150.00

3. BURMESTER, Willy. Signed Postcard Photo. 1922.

The brilliant German violinist (1869-1933) was a student of Joachim. From 1886 he made frequent concert tours throughout Europe and America. Signed "Willy Burmester" in pencil vertically across the postcard. Scarce. (3 3/8 x 5 3/8 inches) \$175.00

4. CASALS, Pablo. Signed Photo. 1930.

A wonderful photo of the great cellist, shown seated, playing the cello. Inscribed and signed along the bottom of the photo "Pablo Casals." (5 3/4 x 8 1/4 inches, several small creases, sl. trimmed, doesn't lie flat, but that won't affect anything if it is matted and/or framed) Signed photos of Casals with his cello are very rare. \$650.00

5. DRDLA, Franz. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. Vienna, April 20, 1927.

The great Bohemian violinist (1868-1944), was a student of Hellmesberger, Jr. On an album leaf, he has written three bars of his famous "Serenade", and signed "Franz Drdla". (7 1/2 x 4 1/2 inches) \$250.00 **Sold!**

6. ERNST, Heinrich Wilhelm. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. 1833.

The great Moravian violinist (1814-1865), also a brilliant violist who played Berlioz's Harold in Italy under the composer's direction in 1842, was acknowledged as the greatest violin virtuoso of his time after Paganini had died. The 19 year old virtuoso has written 22 double bars of music on a piano staff (a piano piece?) and signed "HW Ernst", followed by the place and date. The "p" from a word above the signature makes it a look a bit messy. Extremely scarce. (8 x 5 1/4 inches, mounting traces) \$600.00

7. FLONZALEY QUARTET. Signed Photo.

This wonderful American string quartet, established in 1902 in New York by the Swiss banker Edward J. De Coppet for private performances in his house. The group was named after De Coppet's summer estate, where the first rehearsals were held. One of the most important quartets in the US in the first quarter of the century. A wonderful, elegant photo, shown playing their instruments, signed by the four members, Adolfo Betti, Alfred Pochon, Louis Bailly and Iwan d'Archangeau. (8

8. FRANCESCATTI, Zino. Typed Letter Signed.

The great French violinist has written a letter about a concert which will include the Bach Concerto in A Minor at the Concerts Colonne. Signed "Zino Francescatti." (5 3/8 x 8 3/8 inches, fold) \$125.00

9. GEYER, Stefi. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. 1909.

The great Hungarian-born Swiss violinist (1888-1956) was a pupil of Hubay in Budapest. She taught at the Zurich Conservatory from 1923-1953. Bartok was in love with her and wrote his first concerto for her. She created the violin part in the Bartok Chamber Concerto in 1927. She has drawn a staff on an album leaf and written 4 bars of music which she has identified as Grieg. (6 x 3 3/4 inches) Very scarce. \$250.00

10. HALIR, Carl. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. 1905.

The Bohemian violinist (1859-1909) was a student of Bennewitz and Joachim. He introduced the Lalo concerto to Paris. He was leader at the Bayreuth Festival. In 1893 he became de Ahna's successor in the Joachim quartet. He excelled both as virtuoso and chamber music player. He writes a line of music in pencil.

11. HARRISON, May. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed.

The wonderful English violinist (1891-1959), sister of the cellist Beatrice Harrison, was a student at the Royal College of Music in London. She studied with Arbos, Rivarde and Auer. At age 18, she took Kreisler's place at a Mendelssohn Festival at Helsingfors, and in 1909 appeared with the Berlin Philharmonic. On an album leaf, she has written the first three bars of the Bach Chaconne, which she has identified. She has also written "Only great and good art can be truly loved." (Ruskin), and "Forget-me-not." Boldly signed "May Harrison." (5 1/8 x 7 7/8 inches) Very scarce.

12. HESS, Willy. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. 1898.

The German violinist and teacher (1859-1939) studied with his father, who was a pupil of Spohr, and Joachim. He was concertmaster in Frankfurt, Rotterdam, the Hallé, and the Boston Symphony (1904-1910). From 1910-1928 he taught at the Hochschule in Berlin. On an album leaf, in pencil, he has drawn a staff and written four bars of the Beethoven concerto. Inscribed and signed "Willy Hess" followed by the place and date. Uncommon. (6 1/2 x 8 inches)

13. HINDEMITH, Paul. Signed Program Photo. 1962.

The great German-born American composer (1895-1963) began his musical studies on the violin. He was concertmaster of the Frankfurt Opera Orchestra, and played viola in the Amar String Quartet for 7 years. He was one of the leading masters of 20th-century music. He has inscribed and signed "Paul Hindemith" followed by the date next to his photo in a concert program which included Fournier performing the Hindemith cello concerto. (5 7/8 x 8 1/4 inches, some wear along the edge, nominally affecting the signature)

14. HUBAY, Jenó. Signed Portrait on Program Flyer. 1923.

The celebrated Hungarian violinist (1858-1937), was a student of Joachim and Vieuxtemps. His pupils included Vecsey, Szigeti, Telmányi and Eddy Brown. He has signed "J. Hubay" in pencil, upside down, along side the portrait. (9 1/4 x 12 1/2 inches, folds, worn) Hubay autographs are quite scarce.

15. HUBERMAN, Bronislaw. Signed Postcard Photo with Musical Quotation. 1935.

The great Polish violinist (1882-1947), made his debut at age 7. He studied with Lotto, then Grigorovich, H. Heermann and Marsick. In 1936 he founded the Palestine Symphony. Shown in a head and shoulders portrait, playing the violin. Signed "Bronislaw Huberman" and dated, with four bars from the Vieuxtemps Grande Polonaise. (5 1/2 x 3 3/4 inches, the signature is quite faded, some wear around the edges, the musical quote is also a bit faded)

16. JAPHA, George. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. 1867.

The German violinist (1835-1892) was a student of Ferdinand David and Dreyschock in Leipzig, and Edmond Singer and Alard. He taught at the Cologne Conservatory and was the leader of the quartet there. He has written on a half-sheet of manuscript paper, 8 double bars of music titled Allegretto. Inscribed "George Japha" with the place and date. Scarce. (10 1/4 x 5 inches)

17. KREISLER, Fritz. Typed Letter Signed. 1919.

The great Austrian-born American violinist writes in this letter addressed to the Vice-President of the Columbia Trust Co., New York, he explains that "the drawing out of my balance" did not mean he was closing his account. He continues, "... I am just now deeply involved in charity work for my country, Austria, which involves a heavy strain on all my resources..." He has signed "Fritz Kreisler." Although this letter does not have a musical content, it is interesting to see his devotion to his country in the aftermath of World War I. Kreisler letters are quite scarce. 18. LAUB, Ferdinand. AUTOGRAPH LETTER SIGNED. 1861.

The eminent Czech violinist (1832-1875), made his first public appearance at age 6, toured Austria and Germany from 1846, and was Konzertmeister in Weimar from 1853-55. He became professor at the Moscow Conservatory in 1866. He writes to a dear friend that he will be coming to Krefeld and to prepare Mr. von Beckerrath for his concert. He's looking forward to coming to Krefeld and will also play in Cologne and Belgium. Boldly signed "Ferdinand Laub". Laub autographs are very scarce. (5 1/2 x 8 3/4 inches, folds)

19. LÉONARD, Hubert. Autograph Letter Signed. 1866.

The great Belgian violinist (1819-1890), was a student of Rouma, Prume and Habeneck. He succeeded De Beriot as professor at the Brussels Conservatory. He has written a letter to a friend, asking for information about a mystery person. He has signed "H. Léonard.". Léonard autographs are quite scarce. (1 page, 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 inches, folds, matted and framed to 7 3/4 x 10 1/2 inches)

21. MARTEAU, Henri. Signed Postcard Photo.

The great French-born, Swedish violinist (1874-1934) studied with H. Leonard and Garcin, began his concert career as a youth, playing in Vienna when he was 10 and in London when he was 14. In 1908 he succeeded Joachim as violin teacher at the Hochschule in Berlin. He has boldly signed "Henri Marteau" across the bottom of this head and shoulders portrait. Also signed on the verso. 22. MENUHIN, Yehudi. Signed Photo. 1932.

The celebrated American violinist (1916-1999) was a student of Louis Persinger and Enesco. He had a sensational career as a young child, playing the Beethoven concerto when he was 11 years old. A wonderful ¾ length portrait of the violinist, standing, holding the violin. Inscribed and signed "Yehudi Menuhin" followed by the date. A letter written to the widow of Paul Kochanski, "Forgive my intruding in this most difficult moment of your life. Our loss is irreparable and inconsolable-what yours must be is beyond human conception. Yet a life mate of so fine a man could not fall short of his standard, and I pray, that you many find the necessary strength and courage to continue fostering your husband's and our friend's ideals." 27. MILSTEIN, Nathan. Signed Photo.

The great Russian-American violinist (1904-1992), was a student of Stoliarsky and Auer. He played with Horowitz and Piatigorsky in sonatas and trios. He had one of the longest, most distinguished careers of any violinist, and is considered by many to be in a class with Heifetz. A wonderful pose, he is shown seated, with his chin resting on his hand, his violin under his arm, bow in hand. Inscribed and signed "N. Milstein." Not dated, but probably from the 1940's or 50's. 28. MILSTEIN, Nathan. Signed Photo. 1937.

The great Russian-American violinist (1904-1992), was a student of Stoliarsky and Auer. He played with Horowitz and Piatigorsky in sonatas and trios. He had one of the longest, most distinguished careers of any violinist, and is considered by many to be in a class with Heifetz. He is shown in a head and shoulders portrait. Inscribed and signed "N. Milstein" followed by the date. (8 x 10 inches, some minor wear and creases) \$650.00

29. MONTEUX, Pierre. Signed Photo. 1937.

The great French-born American conductor (1875-1964) studied at the Paris Conservatory, received first prize for violin, and was then a violist with the Colonne Orchestra. In 1911 he became conductor for Diaghilev's Ballet Russes. He was one of the finest technicians of the baton. He led the world premieres of Stravinsky's Petrouchka, Le Sacre du printemps and Le Rossignol, Ravel's Daphnis et Chloé, and Debussy's Jeux. From 1936-1952 he was the conductor of the San Francisco Symphony. A fabulous head and shoulders portrait, inscribed and signed on the mount "Pierre Monteux" followed by the date. 30. MUSIN, Ovide. Signed Photo. 1904.

The great Belgian violinist (1854-1929) studied with Heynberg and Léonard at the Liège Conservatory, taking 1st violin prize at the age of 13 and the gold medal at 15. He toured Europe from 1874-1882 and went to America in 1883. He opened his own school in New York in 1908. A wonderful photo, mounted on board, inscribed and signed "Ovide Musin" across the photo and the mount, followed by the date. 31. OISTRAKH, David. Typed Letter Signed. 1961.

The great Russian violinist (1908-1974) writes to Mr. Shaberman, "I was touched by the thoughts which prompted this gift." He continues, "As always we both enjoy our concerts here, and we are happy in the thought of being able to give pleasure and joy to the audiences with our music making. Signed "David Oistrakh". An interesting look at the thoughts and feelings of this great artist. (7 x 9 inches, folds) \$325.00

32. ONDRICEK, Frantisek. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. 1892.

The great Czech violinist (1857-1922) was a student of Massart. He gave the first performances of the Dvorak concerto. On a large sheet, he has drawn a staff and written 4 bars entitled Romanza, Andante con espressione. Very boldly signed "F. Ondricek, followed by the date. The signature is 5 inches long. (11 1/2 x 7 1/2 inches, some smudging and ink sploches on the signature) \$200.00

33. PAPINI, Guido. Autograph Musical Quotation Signed. 1882.

The great Italian violinist (1847-1912) was a pupil of Giorgetti at Florence. He made his debut at the age of 13. In 1874 he appeared at the Musical Union, playing the viola. For several years he was president of the College of Violinists in London. He excelled both as a soloist and chamber music player. He composed a large quantity of very effective solo pieces, as well as a tutor for violin. He toured with Rubinstein, von Bülow and Bottesini. He has written one very long virtuoso bar which includes a fabulous 27 note run. (6 1/4 x 4 1/4 inches) Very scarce. \$175.00

34. PASQUIER TRIO. Signed Photo. 1939.

An interesting photo of this important trio, established in 1927, made up of three brothers. Inscribed to the violin pedagogue Edmund Zygmant. (8 3/4 x 6 1/2 inches) \$175.00

The great cellist has written to a friend, "I will not be able to express my gratitude for your friendship which is so dear to me. 36. ROSÉ, Arnold. Signed Postcard Photo. 1934.

The great Austrian violinist (1863-1946) was concertmaster of the Vienna Phil and Opera orchestra for 57 years! His quartet, founded in 1888, premiered some of the later works of Brahms and was known as the successor to the Joachim Quartet. A very nice head and shoulders portrait of the violinist shown seated. 37. SIVORI, Camillo. Signed Lithograph.

The great Italian violinist (1815-1894), a student of Paganini's teacher Giacomo Costa, and reportedly Paganini's only student, was considered one of the great violin virtuosos of the 19th century. He is shown in a famous head and shoulders portrait, with his facsimile signature below. Inscribed and signed "Camillo Sivori." (4 5/8 x 7 1/2 inches, trimmed, lightly stained) Very scarce. \$650.00

The great Italian violinist (1815-1894), a student of Paganini's teacher Giacomo Costa, and reportedly Paganini's only student, was considered one of the great violin virtuosos of the 19th century. The great American violinist (1888-1953) was a student of Chiti and Buitrago before entering the Bologna Conservatory at the age of 14. He later studied with Lefort. He made his American debut in 1908, and gave the US premiers of the violin concertos of Dohnany, Elgar and Barber. His own works include an orchestra suite, 2 violin concertos, a string quartet, a violin sonata, etc. He is shown seated, holding his violin and bow, and has inscribed and signed "Albert Spalding" followed by the date.
